

The Basics

- The 2022 Grand Tour will run from March 1st September 30th, 2022.
- Entry fee is \$25.00 (Individual) or \$50 for 2-Up.
- To be considered a finisher you must accumulate 15 points. You will then earn a Grand Tour shirt and entry into the prize drawing (additional prize drawings for higher point levels).
- You do not need to be a GLMC member to participate; a rider number will be assigned to you if you do not already have one.
- There is no cut-off date for entries. We've had riders sign up for a GLMC Grand Tour in August.
- Grand Tour Rider "flags" will be issued as electronic files. You can print them off to be displayed however you wish.
- Qualifying photos include your bike, GT flag, and legible sign or other information required in the locations list.
- If for some reason a descriptive sign does not exist, contact the Rallymaster or do your best to prove you were at the location. A lat/long GPS picture with rally flag and motorcycle may be used as a last resort.
- Internationally shipped finisher t-shirts may require additional shipping and handling fees, to be determined on a case by case basis. Contact the rally master for more details.

2022 Locations

- General Locations worth 1 point each. Town names must start with a G, L, M, or C.
 - Any airport (active airports, no museums)
 - Any train station (active stations, no museums)
 - Any racetrack (go-kart, motocross, NASCAR, drag strip, etc.)
 - 9/11 memorials* (see note in planes combo below)
- Sponsors Combo Locations worth 1 point each with an additional 3 points if you get all three.
 - Fun Sports of Hutchinson, 16235 MN-7, Hutchinson, MN
 - The MotoCycle Shop, 1022 5th St SE, Watertown, SD

- South Shore GLMC Riding Area, East of South Shore, SD on SD-20
- **Special Combo Locations.** Each individual location is worth **3 points each** with an **additional 15 points** if you get all three in a category.
 - Planes combo:
 - Buddy Holly Crash Site, 22728 Gull Ave, Clear Lake, IA
 - Chose one of the following options:
 - o Glasses marker by the road requires a photo of your bike and rally flag
 - Memorial along the fence line, if you choose to walk to it, a photo of the memorial and your flag.
 - Any 9/11 memorial
 - You can get more than one, but only the one claimed in the combo bonus will count as 3 points. All subsequent 9/11 memorials will be 1 point. You can not use two 9/11 memorials for the combo bonus.
 - Any other airplane historical site, museum, or memorial. Working airports do not count here as they are in the general location section.
 - Trains combo:
 - Golden Spike National Historical Park, 6200 N 22300 W, Corinne, UT (park sign picture)
 - Mid Continent Railway Museum, E8948 Museum Rd, North Freedom, WI (museum sign on Diamond Hill Rd near the water tower)
 - Any train car inside a town, for display, and not on an active railway.
 - Automobiles combo:
 - Carhenge, 2151 Co Rd 59, Alliance, NE (entry sign in driveway)
 - Any Route 66 highway marker sign along the actual route (on a pole or painted on road)
 - Any automobile museum (Pioneer Auto Museum, Henry Ford Museum, etc.)
 - Motorcycles combo:
 - Barber Motorsports Park and Museum, 6040 Barber Motorsports Pkwy, Leeds, AL (sign on building visible from museum parking lot)
 - Wheels through Time, 62 Vintage Lane, Maggie Valley, NC (sign for access road along Soco Road)
 - Any other motorcycle museum (Sturgis Museum, National Motorcycle Museum, etc.)
- International Combination Locations. Each individual location is worth 1 point, and if you get all four it is worth an additional 6 points. All locations must be in the same country, and outside the United States of America. International bonus is limited to four locations in one outside country.
 - Any other airplane historical site, museum, or memorial (not at a working airport).
 - Any train car inside a town for display (not on an active railway).
 - Any automobile museum (similar to Pioneer Auto Museum, Henry Ford Museum, etc.)
 - Any motorcycle museum (similar to Sturgis Museum, National Motorcycle Museum, etc.)

Rally Placard

- A PDF file will be emailed to each rider with their Rider Number. We recommend taking the file to an office supply store to have it printed on white cardstock and laminated. You can print from home too, it doesn't matter to us. Some riders have even made stickers to apply to their bikes.
- Placard size: 9X6 works pretty well, but it can be whatever size you want. Just make sure scorers can see it clearly in your pictures.
- If you lose your placard, print a new one! What if you lost the original email or pdf? Email the Rallymaster and we can help out.

• Luddite? Contact the Rallymaster and we can talk it over.


Photos and Submissions

Items that MUST be in the photo (in order of importance):

- 1) Your rally placard.
- 2) Whatever the instructions tell you to take a picture of.
- 3) A significant portion of your bike. (any bike, regardless if you own, rent or borrow, is acceptable)

a) Some locations may not be safe to park your motorcycle. We understand this and will allow accompanying photos with the rally placard to help validate the location. See the example shown below. Picture one has a bike, flag, and sign. Picture two is zoomed in to read the sign.

b) Some spots might be tough to park right next to the specific location, so take a picture of your bike and flag where possible, and then another picture of the bonus location. A shared landmark or your bike in the distance in each photo of this type is helpful.



Additional information for 2-Up Riders:

- 1) 2-Up riders will share the same placard.
- 2) The placard and either the driver or passenger must be in the photo if 2-up.
- 3) Submissions of the same photo are not required for each person, you can submit one photo for both riders.
- 4) Riding 2-up is not required for the entire summer. For example, the driver may visit 35 locations and score the related points while the passenger was riding along for 25 locations and score differing points.
- 5) If signed up for 2-up, and no person appears in the picture, please note which person is claiming the individual points. Example: Joe Schmoe rides alone, takes a picture as shown above. Title: "Joe Bonneville Salt Flats". If Joe took his wife Jane along, one of the two would be in the picture and it would be titled "Bonneville Salt Flats"

Media submissions

1) We are allowing digital photo submissions or physically mailing them, whichever you prefer.

- 2) Submissions must be postmarked or emailed no later than September 30th, 2022.

- 4) Digital submissions must be sent to <u>glmcgrandtour@gmail.com</u>
- 5) Polaroid photos, digital prints, or standard photos are all acceptable.
- 6) Digital media may be submitted on CD, flash drive, SD card, or via cloud service.
- 7) CDs will not be returned to the rider after scoring.
- 8) Every effort will be made to return SD cards and flash drives.
- 9) Google drive and similar cloud hosting services may be used. Please make sure to contact the Rallymaster before the deadline if using this method to ensure they can view your content.
- 10) Digital media submissions still need to be labeled and a list of names and locations submitted.
- 11) Important! Along with the photos, each submission needs to include a list or spreadsheet listing each location. For each point claimed, along with the photo(s) please include:
 - a) Name of each location
 - i) Photo should have a filename the same as their location
 - Example of naming multiple photos of the same location: "Bonneville Salt Flats 1", "Bonneville Salt Flats 2"
 - b) Nearest city and state of the location.
 - c) The list of locations can be a word text document, excel spreadsheet, or physically written list. An example is shown at the end of this document.
 - d) Please note in your listing if you are claiming a combo bonus.

Awards and Prizes

- <u>To be considered a finisher you must accumulate 15 points</u>. You will then earn a Grand Tour shirt and entry into the prize drawing.
- The amount of door prizes is determined by the amount of entries. The more people that sign up, the more prizes there will be.
- Riders with 20 or more points will be entered multiple times into the prize drawing: one entry for each 10-point level above 20 points. (For example, with 46 total points, you would be entered into the drawing 4 times).
- Prizes for the top three finishers will be a tire (1st place) and gift certificates from Fun Sports of Hutchinson
- You can win multiple prizes.
- Other prizes for the drawing will most likely include gas cards.
